REFLECTIONS FROM TOM...

What IS a "Blessed Church"?

I suppose that most of the time when we ask that question, the answers tend to be <u>quantitative</u>: such as growing in size, programs, budget, people, and so on ...

Or at least that is what I have heard from church leaders over many years.

Yet, there DOES seem to be a new awareness, that Blessing can (and should) be something more <u>qualitative</u>, as in the quality of our relationship with God, God's purposes, and God's People. Then the rest can follow from that.

At an event sponsored by the regional church organization I once served, we had a keynote speaker, Rev. N. Graham Standish, who was in great demand as a speaker because of a book that had been recently published. There was a LOT of resonance with it among churches seeking to be more, for God. It was simply entitled Becoming a Blessed Church, and the central theme was not about generating more "stuff", increasing "the metrics", or any other lingo of the day. It was about doing things that enabled the Church to discern God's Purpose, to celebrate and experience God's Presence, and to open ourselves to the impact of God's Power.

Purpose, Presence, Power. Graham noted that these weren't things that normally were taught in the seminaries to Pastors in Preparation; perhaps they did not sound 'theological' enough. But the wonderful (and relevant point) is that they are each thoroughly Biblical. Jesus-Stuff. Spiritual Life. Ministry. And, however we go about getting in touch with God's Purpose, Presence and Power – this is what makes for Becoming Blessed.

As Salem UCC continues through the Search Process for the next settled Pastor, this is where Graham encourages us to focus – how to become Blessed as a congregation, preparing for the future God wills for Salem Church and for each individual life of faith. So ... think and pray about:

For what Purposes does God place Salem Church right here, right now ... in the Verona area and within a deeply yearning world?
