Dear Salem Church Members and Friends,

I am looking forward to an experience that I have never had before: a UCC Annual Congregational Meeting! Since, as your Interim Pastor, I now have “dual standing” with the United Church of Christ and the Presbyterian Church, it will be interesting and inspiring to see how the UCC emphasis on the strength of the individual congregation will be expressed.



In our case, we are on the front end of a new era for Salem Church, as the congregation begins the process to prepare for, and then search for, the next long-term Pastor. What we do now, the enthusiasm we focus on this “new thing”, and the deep-listening that we do to God’s Spirit will greatly impact the future of our congregation for MANY years to come.

THANKGIVING BASKETS FOR BPNN



Once again, due to Covid, the collection of donations and distribution of the baskets will be different than in years past. Most of the food for the baskets will be provided through Second Harvest at no cost to Badger Prairie Needs Network. TOTENFEST: NOVEMBER 21

We will observe the Liturgy of Totenfest in our online worship service for November 21. Totenfest is the ceremony in which we remember by name those from our congregation who have died in the last twelve months. It is a liturgy that falls each year on the Sunday immediately prior to the beginning of Advent. This is the last Sunday of the church's year. A new church year begins on the First Sunday of Advent.

In the Liturgy of Totenfest there is a roll call of the dead. As each name is read, a candle is lit in their honor, and a bell is tolled. There is an extra candle in addition to one for each person from the church who has died. At the time the extra candle is lit, worshipers are invited to name aloud anyone whom they chose to remember.


