MARK-ET PLACE

The Threefold Mission of the Church

Swiss theologian Emil Brunner wrote in the 1930s that “the church exists by mission as fire exists by burning.” Mission, in other words, is absolutely essential to the life of the church. The church cannot be said to exist where it is not engaged in mission.

But what is the church’s mission? What is the work that works to make the church alive and vital?

My understanding is that a congregation has, under God, a mission that is best understood in a trinitarian sense. That is to say, the church has one mission – to serve God in the service of others – but this one mission has three modes. Where one mode of the church’s mission is outsized at the expense of the others that church, while it may have energy around one particular area of emphasis, does not yet have the kind of life our Lord wishes it to have.

The three modes I see in the church’s one mission are an internal mode, an external mode, and a diverse mode.

The church’s internal mission is service to itself and its own people. This aspect of congregational life is often disparaged as being too insular, too little concerned with others and the world outside the church. While this inward mission ought never be over-accentuated, undoing the fullness of the Christian ideal for congregations, it cannot rightly be ignored. The Apostle Paul said we are to “rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep” (Rom. 12:15). And a greater than Paul said we are to love one another (Jn. 15:12). This is the church living in fellowship, showing concern for its members, comforting and supporting them, teaching them and providing for their spiritual needs. It is the congregation’s mission to itself and its own members. This should never be the church’s mission exclusively but it should not be excluded as the church goes about its life in Christ. Part of our mission is to lovingly serve one another in the household of faith.

The church’s external mode of mission is service to the world outside the congregation. This public ministry of the church includes both social service

work and social justice work. The work of social service involves aiding the marginalized. The work of social justice involves addressing those aspects of society – whether governments, laws, policies, or programs – that contribute to the marginalization of persons. The church’s mission is to aid the oppressed and challenge the oppressor. There is often little disagreement as to the importance of Christian social service, but there is sometimes pushback against the idea of Christian social justice work, mostly on the grounds that it is something liberal and left-leaning, if not worse. The fact is that a conservative approach to the Bible leads to social justice work and involvement. At the risk of seeming to proffer a proof-text, I point to none other than Jesus’ own remark in the Sermon on the Mount that we Christians are to be as salt and light in society (Mt. 5:13-16). The church has from its Master this call to a mission outside itself. This external mode of the church’s mission cannot be the only thing the church values as important but it dare not be a neglected thing if the church is to be whole and healthy.

The church’s third mode of mission is diverse. This may be as difficult to pinpoint and to see as is the Third Person of the Trinity. The church’s external mode of mission is something that is organized for the whole congregation to participate in, such as a food drive. The diverse mode recognizes that each member of the church has his or her own particular gifts and talents which are to be used for the good of others, and often are as the people volunteer with various projects in the community. Elton Trueblood said that the church is its most active when it is empty; he meant when the people were out in society volunteering in their various chosen ways. It is a mistake to suppose a church is not engaged in mission if it has no external project the people are working on together, whether it is gathering clothing in a drive or gathering on the streets for a protest march. Insofar as its people are serving – whether as tutors or pantry workers or blood donors or library helpers – the church is in mission. And it is possible this diverse mission may bring more energy to the congregation than some formal external mission.


